Special Notice Aston-on-Trent Village Centre Traffic Congestion Alleviation

The Parish Council (PC) are very much aware of the deteriorating traffic problems through the centre of the village. Our thanks to all residents who have contacted us with their views, experiences and suggestions. Accordingly, the PC has been in consultation with Derbyshire County Council and received initial proposals to alleviate the situation. Some of the proposals are already being pursued, and others remain to be firmed up and finalised. We welcome feedback from our parishioners on options before we proceed, noting the PC preferred solution is a combination of a clearly marked one way system, alongside non-parking / passing places on Derby and Weston Road approaches to the Village Centre.

Items being pursued already - supporting a clearly marked one way system:

- Road marking re-lining that forms the main village junction between Weston and Derby Roads
- Install new 'One Way' text and straight-ahead arrow in the junction vicinity with Derby Road
- Install new 'One Way' text and straight-ahead arrow in front of house number 16 The Green
- Renew the intermittent line between Derby Road and The Green and the 'No Entry' text at the short section end of The Green
- Relocate the 'One Way' sign and post from the wrong position to opposite the access road (near to the boundary of house number 23)

Items your feedback is sought: non parking and establishing passing places: 4 options (layouts below) include various forms of double yellow lines spaced along Weston Road and Derby Road where we get the most concerns raised by Parishioners. The aim for each is to ease traffic by creating passing places or reducing parking capacity in key areas. Based on the feedback received to date, plus considered County Council Highways & Parish Council views, we believe that a combination of Options 1 and 4 to be the best outline solution to pursue for a trial period.



Residents will find pro's and con's to each option. Please respond with feedback via email to:

feedback.astonpc@gmail.com both for and against the proposals so we get a balanced view of the Villagers' opinions. Once received and considered, the Parish Council's preference is to apply for a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order which can be used to restrict parking (create road markings/lines) on a trial type basis for up to 18 months. In this way we can attempt to find a solution and gather feedback before making any changes permanent. The plans at this stage illustrate the options and can be tweaked before any final designs are chosen. For example, the PC believes the passing points presented in option 4 are too bunched, and it may be better to extend farther back along Weston Road. Accordingly, we can revisit these in due course after we have had feedback. All comments and feedback to be received no later than 15 February 2024 please.

Aston-on-Trent History Group Each Monday morning we're in the Heritage Centre updating our records and adding

new material that is brought in from residents. This is something we very much encourage as personal stories and recollections are the most interesting ways to discover about Aston's past lives. We recently received a short note from a former resident recalling life in the 1950's. He remembers when the village was just a small farming community, Derby Road being the daily route for a herd of cows to and from Brace's farm. Very few people had cars but his father was the proud owner of a Sunbeam Dawn. How many people reading this have memories of the 1950s in Aston? Is anyone prepared to write a few lines about village life and drop it into our Monday archive sessions? We'd love it if you could share your memories, written or spoken and we'll throw in a free cuppa as well. Friends of Aston Brickyard (FAB)

The weather has not been good for working on site these past few months. We managed to get the grassland and wild flower meadow mown with thanks to Derbyshire Countryside Services Rangers, but we were left with over three quarters of an acre to rake into the sides when it was heavy with rain. A tremendous effort by FAB volunteers, which took many people hours, meant we were finally able to move the grass cuttings before they rotted down in the main areas. Leaving them in situ would have prevented spring growth of our wild flowers. The strong winds from the two winter storms caused some tree damage but on the whole we got away with small branches blown and with regular checks that the public trails were open and safe. We also had some successes. We planted a new grove of twenty-four Salix saplings, best known as Goat Willow, at the request of the East Midlands Butterfly Conservation Trust. Goat Willow is a favourite food source of the Purple Emperor which is slowly moving into this part of the country, so to have them on site will be a real bonus. We will also be planting honeysuckle to attract the declining White Admiral, a real success if that happens. When FAB took on managing the Brickyard Plantation in 2012 only four species were recorded. This year East Midlands Butterfly Conservation Trust recorded twenty-six! A testament to FAB volunteers and our support organisations. Weather permitting the coming months will be busy as we prepare the site for the coming spring. Neighbourhood Watch



Helping Aston to Stay Safe

Happy New Year from your Neighbourhood Watch Team. Please support us, so we can support you.

Committee: We have not received any enquiries to help out at the committee but most of our coordinators remain in place though so currently the Watch remains structurally sound. We will hold a meeting for coordinators in the Spring to discuss this and the long term future for our Watch scheme. In the meantime anyone interested can ring Tony on 792114.

Membership: Our membership is always open. The formal renewal process runs every 2 years and your ongoing support is appreciated. Thanks to all your coordinators who put in their time to ensure the process works well. If you are not a member and would like to be please contact us and we will put you in touch with your local coordinator.

Coordinators: We still have some vacancies. The role is not onerous. Could you help? You would need to pass on our messages to your neighbours, most easily done via email via a secure group and collect subscription every 2 years. If you are interested in becoming more involved as a coordinator that would be welcome as some existing coordinators have large areas or are supporting households away from their own close neighbours.

Watch Communication: The village remains relatively quiet in relation to disorder and crime. However if you do hear of anything please make contact via your coordinator or just use the email in this article. Please don't presume that contacting the Police means they will tell us, or keep us updated. Additionally we never take our information from Social Media, the information therein is rarely reliable enough for us to publish around your neighbours. We do always act whenever a coordinator passes a message which has come directly from a victim and where that victim has agreed for us to circulate.

Winter update: Some recent incidents of note include 2 males wandering around the Houses and Drives at 3am in the morning, early January and a House Burglary on Aston Hall Drive, also early January. The Police were contacted on both occasions. Details of these were circulated in a timely fashion to your coordinators. It is always advisable to review your own security situation. Do you have an alarm, if you do, do you set it when you are out? Have you considered CCTV or Door Bell camera, the Male in Moor Lane at 3am was duly recorded by a Door Bell device?

Drugs around the Village: Is it a problem? We know it is out there, but is it here? The Watch has received some reports of Drug misuse around the village, sometimes evidenced by paraphernalia left behind or seen by residents. Please keep an eye out. If you see anything contact the Beat Team. Even the softest of recreational Drugs can lead to long term harm that may be in many forms, medical, financial, family life, ASB and so on!

Remember we live in a safe place and working together we can keep it that way.

Please keep us informed. If you are a victim of crime don't forget to report to your CO-ORDINATOR. Emergency calls: 999 Non urgent calls: 101. Crime Stoppers: 0800 555 111.



Long Walk Woods: The footpath was closed by Richmond Homes at the end of October for safety reasons. SAVE is working closely with Parish Councils, Richmond, SDDC and residents to help ensure that any tree that presents an immediate risk of serious harm is dealt with; that trees removed are replaced with long lived varieties of native trees; and there is a ten-year plan in place to preserve the woods and wildlife.

EMA: We previously thanked everybody who contributed to EMA's Noise Consultation. The Noise Action Plan is now with the Government and should be approved early this year.

One positive outcome is that restrictions on Training Flights came into force as planned on 1st January. What you can do to help: Keep your eyes out for our next leaflet with details of how you can respond to the Local Plan when it arrives. Also, please consider joining us. 
